Council received information regarding delays in the remaining fire tower necessary for the new communications system for the County. Hopefully problems will soon be solved and the much needed improved system will be up and running. Don Hilborn attended on behalf of Thistle Theatre explaining their plans to apply for grant money to install a lift in the Embro Town Hall. Accessibility has long been an issue and the proposed equipment, along with some improvements to the washroom, will help make the building useable by many more people.

Plans are underway to again take Council meetings to schools in Zorra. Last year's visits were an opportunity for students to learn about municipal government first hand and their participation was well planned and most helpful. Watch for news of special guests we hope will be able to attend.

Progress is being made with the Waud collection to be housed at the Beachville Museum and the display should be ready for public viewing early next year.
