

Message from the Mayor

The new Zorra Municipal Centre is opening this spring!

The new office will accommodate staff, comply with accessibility laws, reduce energy consumption and costs, and provide an 88 space licensed childcare to support local families and businesses. Please watch for an open house and drop in and say hi!

There are also some big changes to the staff leadership at Zorra Township.

While sad to see long time Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) Don MacLeod retire later in 2024 (more on that as the day approaches...), I am very happy to announce that the current Director of Finance, Diane Larder, has been selected as the Township's new CAO. Given the chance to go through a recruitment process or promote Diane, in the end, it was clear that Diane was the best decision for Zorra. Since joining Zorra Township in 2021, Diane has shown commitment and a strong focus on inspiring service excellence, innovation, collaboration, and workplace cultural development.

Additionally, there is an organizational restructuring. The Township of Zorra will see

the number of municipal departments reduced from six to two. This is a proactive step to prepare Zorra for the challenges facing municipal government as fiscal pressures mount on local governments. We are continuing to deliver services while finding efficiencies and opportunities in how we manage new roles and responsibilities. We're respecting the hard-earned dollars of our residents by streamlining operations and setting ourselves up to foster a collaborative and positive open-for-business approach. Under the organizational restructuring, Public Works and Recreation will now fall under the Public Services Department. The Corporate and Protective Services Department will encompass Building/Drainage/By-law Enforcement, Fire & Emergency Services, Finance and Legislative Services. And there are many new faces in the organization from Fire, to Recreation, to Public Works. There is an exciting new team developing to deliver the services Zorra residents depend on. 

Reduced Load Season

A reminder to all drivers of heavy trucks and equipment that the reduced load season takes effect from February 15 to April 30 inclusive each year. In accordance with By-law 21-03, signs will be posted on applicable Township roadways.

Half Load Season Rationale

- Minimize long term damage to infrastructure
- Problems caused when roads are soft and often require major repairs
- Prevent additional damage to culverts and bridges
- Heavy loads do damage to road sub-base that is difficult to detect
- Changes in the size of agricultural equipment i.e. large liquid manure trailers
- Multiple aggregate producers in Township
- Infrastructure repair costs borne directly or indirectly by residents
- All of the above lead to safety issues during Half Load Season.

BATTERY RECYCLING



The Township of Zorra has a free program for the recycling of household batteries through Raw Materials Company Inc. (RMC). The program is being offered at four locations throughout the Township:

Please feel free to drop off your batteries at any of the above locations.

Since the start of this program in September 2012, the Township of Zorra has collected and returned 3,236 lbs of batteries to Raw Materials Company for Recycling.

Building Department

Permits

For instructions on how to apply for a building or septic permit, please visit the Building and Drainage section on the Township of Zorra website. Applications should be submitted through www.cloudpermit.com. If you are a first-time user, you will be required to register an account. Please contact Nicole at 519-485-2490 ext. 7231 for any questions related to Cloudpermit.

Did You Know?

Building and septic inspections help ensure that construction meets the requirements of the Building Code, which serves to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public.

Mandatory building inspections are legislatively mandated by the Ontario Building Code, Division C, Subsection 1.3.5.1.

After a building permit or septic permit has been issued and construction has started, Building Officials must inspect the work at various stages during construction. A building or septic permit will clearly outline the required inspections.

- The applicant, owner or authorized agent is responsible to inform the Township when mandatory stages of construction are ready for inspection.
- Failure to complete inspections may result in being ordered to stop work or uncover construction so the inspection(s) can be performed.
- The cost for mandatory inspections is included in the building permit fee.
- Additional inspections can be arranged (an additional fee may apply).
- If construction plans change, revisions are required, or there are deficiencies noted for correction by a Building Official, an inspection must be rebooked and approval must be granted to continue to the next stage of construction.

Closing Permits

Once construction is complete, a final inspection must be completed. This ensures that the permit is closed. Not closing your permit may result in an additional fee.

Booking Inspections

All inspection requests can be booked on Cloudpermit. You will receive a Cloudpermit message confirming the date and approximate time. Alternatively, you can email inspections@zorra.ca or call the office at 519-485-2490 ext. 7231. Please allow at least 24 hours notice.

Additional Residential Units (ARUs)



ARUs are smaller, self-contained dwelling units (i.e., with their own kitchen, bathroom and sleeping areas) that are inside, attached to, or in a detached accessory building on the same property as a single detached house, semi-detached house, or street fronting townhouse. ARUs can take many forms, such as basement apartments, attached suites, tiny homes and coach houses, but they must be smaller than the primary residential unit, within a permanent building (i.e., not a mobile home or recreational vehicle), and connected to municipal water and sewage services, where available.

Drainage

Reminder

Municipal Drains: A municipal drain is a system that moves water from your property and roads.

Municipal storm drains can become clogged with fallen leaves, mulch, grass clippings and other debris. If you notice debris on a storm basin lid, you can clear it off with a rake or contact the Drainage Superintendent at ext. 7224.

Preventing Car Emergencies

It is a good idea to dress for the weather when travelling by vehicle, even if you do not plan to be outside. Warm or waterproof clothing stored where you cannot reach may not help you when you need them!

Other reminders:

- Service your vehicle regularly
- Never transport liquids or gasses that burn in the passenger compartment
- Plants or grass that touch the under side of a hot vehicle can catch fire. Vehicle fires can spread quickly to nearby plants or objects



Fire Safety on the Road

Do you know what to do if your vehicle is on fire? It can happen unexpectedly.

1. Use your turn signal to show your intention to pull over to a safe place, then get the vehicle to the side of the road if it can be done QUICKLY.
2. Turn the engine off.
3. Get everyone out of the car and stay at least 30 metres (100 feet away). There is no safe place near a burning vehicle.
4. Get away from traffic and CALL 911.

Safety in Rentals and Hotels

When looking for rentals or hotels for your summer vacation, remember the following:

- Find a place to stay that is protected by smoke alarms AND carbon monoxide (CO) alarms. Many rentals say if they have alarms on their website.
- The safest rentals have working sprinkler systems
- Some fire alarms flash and make noise. If you cannot hear an alarm, ask the rental if the fire alarm has flashing lights.
- Find an escape plan. If you don't see one, ask for it.
- Read the escape plan. It will show you the best way out and if the elevator is safe during a fire. Count the doors between you and the stairs or exit.
- Keep the room key with you. You may have to go back to your room to get away from a fire that blocks the exit.
- If you are stuck in your room, put a wet towel under the door and use a flashlight or wave to signal at the window. If the sleeping room does not have a window or second exit, it is not a safe place to stay.

Wildfire Season

Wildfire season doesn't watch the calendar. Yellowknife had a wildfire in the winter and under the snow. Each of us need to do our part to prevent wildfire by staying fire safe indoors and outdoors all the time. Wildfires spread through wooded lands and other plant life. In a rural community like Zorra, these large open areas cause fire to spread FAST.

Check the fire department or google Zorra Fire if you don't know the rules before starting any outdoor fire. Zorra Fire and Emergency Services bans fires when the chance of fire spread is high, and wildfire is predicted to spread so fast that the fire department can't keep up. When conditions are right, wildfires can travel almost as fast as cars on the highway. Even when it is calm, wildfires spread out in all directions quickly, meaning that the fire department must fight them over a very large area, beyond where our trucks and hoses can go.

ALL FIRES START SMALL - please be fire safe.

When fires are permitted:

- closely supervise all fires
- make sure the fire is out before leaving the area
- keep kids and pets away from the fire
- burn only treated dry wood

Check the area around your house for things that will burn, including types of plants that may spread fire quickly. Your property is the last line of defense between your home and a fire.

Zorra Municipal and Child Care Centre

The new Zorra Municipal and Child Care Centre is set to open in late May and will be home to an 88 space child care centre and the administrative offices for Zorra Township. The 19,250 ft² building has a total price tag of \$6,721,441 with an additional \$308,475 for equipment and furniture and \$200,000 has been set aside for future solar panel installation. The project received a \$750,000 grant from the Government of Canada and \$500,000 from the County of Oxford. The Township was able to make a profit of \$3,100,000 on the purchase and sale of the former Maple Leaf Foods property in Thamesford and all the profits have been set aside for the ZMC project. Profits from the sale of the former Thamesford Fire Station (\$350,000) and the Municipal Office (\$1,180,000) have been applied to the project. The remaining balance owing on the project will be self-funded and no outside debt will be required. In keeping with Council's carbon neutral policy, fossil fuels will not heat the building and once the solar component has been installed, it is anticipated the building will generate surplus electricity.

By-Law Enforcement

Recreation Vehicle (RV) Parking:

Notice to all RV/boat owners. Our Zoning By-law allows front driveway storage of RVs and boats from May 1 – October 31. After October 31, front driveway storage of these vehicles shall be removed and stored elsewhere. After October 31, the vehicles may be stored on your side lot or rear lot provided that they meet the 5 foot setback.

Rules about dogs:

The weather is now changing and dogs are outside for extended periods of time, please be aware of the Animal Control By-law 43-15. The By-law prohibits dogs from running at large. The result of which may be a fine of \$200.00 plus fees. Dogs require a leash at all times when walked. They shall not wander (Running at Large) on public or other private properties. In addition, all excrement shall be picked-up and properly discarded in a garbage bin as outlined in the By-law. Failure to do so could result in a fine of \$125.00.

Fireworks

Residents may set off consumer fireworks on their private property 2 days prior to and 2 days following Canada Day, Labour Day, Victoria Day and Diwali as long as they are set off before 11PM, by persons 18 years of age or older. Consumer fireworks are prohibited from being discharged inside of any building, structure, or vehicle. Written approval by the Chief Fire Official is required for discharging fireworks from municipal property including streets, lanes,

squares, parks, etc. Reminder for residents to let their neighbours know when they plan to set off fireworks.

Fireworks may be sold in the Township, 7 days prior to Canada Day, Labour Day, Victoria Day and Diwali, to persons 18 years of age or older, as long as the retailer receives an approved permit from the Township.

PARKING UPDATE!

Council passed a Parking By-law update to restrict parking on the west side of Middleton St, within 9m of all entrances to the Thamesford District Recreation Centre. This change will make it safer for traffic to exit the parking lot of the arena. Please keep an eye out for the new parking signage.





Living in a beautiful rural community like Zorra means living in close proximity with wildlife. That's usually something we enjoy, but from time-to-time wildlife can pose concerns.

We've been getting a lot of calls into the office about raccoons lately. Here are a few things to remember:

- If you see a raccoon behaving strangely, do not approach it. Give it ample space, and make sure to keep children and pets well away. The raccoon will most likely move along on its own, given time.
- If you have a raccoon that is hanging around and not moving on from your property, you will need to contact a pest control company to have it removed. The municipality does not remove raccoons (or skunks, etc.) from private property.
- The Humane Society will pick up injured wildlife from private properties and there is no fee for this service.

To help keep your kids and pets safe:

- Don't encourage raccoons to visit your yard. Don't leave any food out, and keep your recycling and waste containers secure until your collection day.
- Talk to your children and tell them not to approach wild animals.
- Walk your dog on a leash, and make sure to check for raccoons before you let your pets outside in your yard.
- As raccoons may carry distemper, make sure that your pets have been vaccinated against the disease.


WILDCAT TRAIL

Tax Department

The 2nd Instalment of your 2024 Taxes is due May 31, 2024. Final 2024 Tax Bills will be issued and mailed in late June/early July with due dates of August 30 and October 31, 2024.

Payments are not reflected on your account until the funds are received by the municipality so please make your payment early. Penalty/Interest is charged on your account if payment is not received by the municipality by the due date.

PAYMENT OPTIONS:

- Cash, Cheque or Debit are all accepted at the office
- By mail - Please allow sufficient time for payment to be delivered to the office. Late delivery will result in penalty/interest being added to the account.
- Online or Telephone banking - to setup your property taxes as a bill payment, go to 'add a bill' and search for "Zorra". Select Zorra Township Tax and enter the Roll Number from your tax bill as your account number.
- Monthly Pre-Authorized Payment Plan, either 10 or 12 month term
- Pre-Authorized Payment Plan on the instalment dates (4 times per year)
- While e-Transfer is available, it is not recommended for tax payments as often roll and/or address information is missing and payments then don't get applied to your account. If you pay using e-Transfer, please make sure to include your Tax Roll No. in the message field for payments. E-transfers are to be sent to accountsreceivable@zorra.ca

Use your 15-digit roll number on your tax bill. For example, if your property roll number was 011- 090-25600-0000, you would enter as 01109025600. If an error occurs, please try again and add the extra four zeros at the end of the number. Please ensure that you allow at least 3 business days before the due date to make sure that the payment reaches our office on time. Receipt of payment after the due date will result in penalty/interest charges being added to the account.

E-billing is available to have your tax bills emailed to you directly, sign up for e-billing from our website at www.zorra.ca/home/our-services/forms under the Finance Department – Property Tax e-billing Sign up.

Please keep your Final 2024 Property Tax Bill for 2024 personal income tax preparation purposes. The Final Tax Bill includes all the information necessary for inclusion on your 2024 personal income tax return. There is a \$10 fee for the provision of a copy of your property tax bill, paper or electronic. There is a \$10 fee for the provision of a Statement of Account.






